

There he was set-up way out yonder in the far back reaches of Mow Camp, in a tent, with his peeps from Maryland, decked out in Army regalia. First impressions do matter, and this one mattered - a lot.

I got to know him the first few years as a racer, and then personally as a gentleman. I got to know him better and better with each passing year, getting to know him especially well when he formed the DelMarVa Lawn Mower Racing Association.

His leadership abilities, organizational skill and mechanical prowess quickly came to light, and I became impressed. When Charles Powell passed away in 2006, Manny reached out to offer his serves as National Chief Steward until which time we could replace Charles. For that we are grateful. He is an engine builder, engine mechanic, has led a racing chapter, and now serves as our National Chief Steward and National Technical Director. Manny is truly a leader of men...and women and kids.

His class, professionalism, honor and values have seeped into the very fiber of USLMRA. Plus, a little trash talking too! He is fair, firm and professional both in the Tech Line and on the track. He treats all racers fairly, and most importantly he keeps us all SAFE. And he is a true Gentleman.

Manny has received honors and accolades from his service in the Army. I've been to his house; I've seen them proudly on display. So too has he won trophies and awards from lawn mower racing. I've been in his garage; I've seen those too.

When Bruce asked me to write a few words about Kerry and Manny, I was immediately taken back to when Charles and I first became involved in this crazy, wonderful world of lawn mower racing and all the warm memories that go with it, and Kerry and Manny were both a huge part of it.

Kerry was there from the beginning. I remember Charles' first race in Decatur, Alabama. Charles looked great, his mower looked great, then in one of the last laps one of his gold plated wheels came flying off. After the race a group of guys came over to the trailer where the disabled mower was and began the post mortem, giving advice and making recommendations. One of those guys was Kerry, and what I remember about that first meeting was he was quiet yet knowledgable. Little did I know he was a mowchine building ninja!

Kerry was in partnership with Dave Zaremba, another quiet guy who became a beast on the track. With Kerry building and Dave driving, they were practically unbeatable! Charles' goal was just to beat them. He knew if he could do that, he could win it all. We hated to see Dave retire, but Kerry had bigger things ahead.

When I first started registration/timing & scoring I knew absolutely nothing about any of it. I would sit with Pete Tyer, who taught me how to do it then turned me loose with it. In spite of my confidence, I would still get butterflies before a race; I wanted to do it perfectly and I felt the stress of getting it right. That is when Kerry started sitting with me to "help" me, even though he'd already forgotten more than I ever knew about racing or timing & scoring. He was always supportive and helpful, and I learned so much from him. We became co-workers, and spent a lot of time together in the "official" truck, telling jokes, swapping stories, and sharing secrets.

I already knew Kerry as a co-worker, a master builder, and a racing expert. I came to know him as a friend, supporter, and confidant. When Charles passed away, Kerry was one of the first ones to reach out to me.

A few months later, he reached out again and asked me to come back to racing. I told him I would have to think about it. When he didn't hear back from me he called again and this time paid me the compliment of lying, saying he "needed" me. We both knew that wasn't true, but it was just like Kerry to consider my feelings and let me know that I am still a member of the racing family. He's got a heart of gold and is giving and considerate. He's caring, conscientious, hard working, and a wonderful ambassador for the USLMRA.

I take full credit for Manny!

In 2003, at Nationals, I was walking through the pit area and happened upon Manny and a young man working on a mower that had Army stickers along with the American flag. My youngest son, Cody, was in the Marines at the time and was awaiting deployment, which was about all this momma could think of. So I struck up a conversation with Manny and told him about my son and my worries for him.

Manny, in his calm, understated way, helped give me peace as well as an understanding about how the military guys watch out for each other. I would walk away, but found myself wandering back to where he was numerous times. He was always gracious about putting up with me, and we became fast friends. There was just a presence about him.

. Later that night, over some adult beverages, I told Bruce, "Hey, I've got this guy I want you to meet. He's good people and I think you'll like him." He asked me who it was and then he promptly forgot about it. The next day, I asked Bruce if he had introduced himself to Manny yet. He gave me a blank look then said, no, he hadn't made it over there. I told him he really needed to meet him, that this guy was the real deal. Bruce just said ok, he'd would get around to it. Well, I'd been married long enough to know what that meant, so I told him I was going to nag him until he did it. He assured me he would, then we got busy with racing.

The next morning at breakfast, there were about eight of us talking and discussing the previous day's racing. Then Bruce announced he had something special to share with us. He proceeded to tell us about a guy he met who had really impressed him, who he thought was a real asset to the lawn mower racing family, who was low key and had a lot of depth. I started to get a little suspicious. Then he talked about the guy's military service, his leadership qualities, and his personable demeanor. Now I'm really getting worked up and I was just about to say something when Bruce produced a "coin" that was given to him by this wonderful person he had accidentally stumbled on, saying that it was a very coveted keepsake and not many people had them.

When he finally noticed I was about to explode I asked him Mr. Wonderful's name and when he said Manny I said, "That's MY coin because that's the guy I was telling you about!'

Well, it turned out Bruce and I were both right (I was right first!) about the kind

of person Manny is and the rest is history.

In all seriousness, racing people are uniquely special. They are family and care for each other. They are together in fun times but, more importantly, in not so fun times. I will be forever grateful for the people who rallied around me when Charles passed away, and then continued to stay in touch long afterward. Because of all they have done I can think of no two men who have contributed more, or who are more deserving, than Kerry Evans and Manny Torres. They have earned their place in the USLMRA Hall of Fame. My congratulations to you both, and long may you mow.





Founded in 2006, the Chase For The Golden Blade is open to all USLMRA Local Chapters: win a trophy at a STA-BIL National Lawn Mower Racing Series event and your designated Chapter gets a point. The Chapter that has accumulated the most points at the conclusion of the season wins the Golden Blade.

The Chase For The Golden Blade was created to promote a friendly rivalry between all sanctioned Local Chapters of the USLMRA. The actual award is a perpetual plaque that is passed on to the winning chapter at the conclusion of the racing season. The winning Chapter has their name added to the plaque and maintains possession until it is passed on at the conclusion of the following season. Along with plaque comes bragging rights.

The inaugural year of the Chase was won by the Michigan Lawn Mower Racing Association. The Florida Lawn Mower Racing Association was a close second. The 2007 season saw a reversal in the final trophy tally with Florida accumulating the most trophies and Michigan taking second. The Golden Blade remained in the Sunshine State for 2008 and 2009, but in 2010 it returned to Michigan.






