

The Chapter that has accumulated the most points at the conclusion of the season wins the Golden Blade.

The Chase For The Golden Blade was created to promote a friendly rivalry between all sanctioned Local Chapters of the USLMRA. The actual award is a perpetual plaque that is passed on

to the winning chapter at the conclusion of the racing season. The winning Chapter has their name added to the plaque and maintains possession until it is passed on at the conclusion of the following season. Along with plaque comes bragging rights.

The inaugural year of the Chase was won by the Michigan Lawn Mower Racing Association. The Florida Lawn Mower Racing Association was a close second. The 2007 season saw a reversal in the final trophy tally with Florida accumulating the most trophies and Michigan taking second. The Golden Blade remained in the Sunshine State for 2008 and 2009, but in 2010 it returned to Michigan.

From Dubba G. himself:

- 1. We are looking for people with dedication, integrity and conviction to stand up for what they believe, even when unpopular.
- 2. The candidate will carry a positive disposition.
- 3. Actions on the track, including driving style, will show gentlemanly demeanor. Not necessarily always deferring to other drivers, but not creating unsafe situations. Their competitive spirit needs to be tempered with a "spirit of a sound mind."
- 4. Candidates are willing to help others. When times of need arise, sacrifice is not uncommon, being willing to volunteer, add a hand, step up to the plate.
- 5. Enthusiasm is key. They want to be here, at the race, in the paddock, and at the driver's meeting. Their excitement will help the group's positive energy grow and surge just by their presence. People like being around the candidate.
- 6. General knowledge of what's going on on race day, at the race track, in the paddock, in general. This would imply that first month rookies may not fully qualify, but depending on their learning curve, they could be in the running. This doesn't mean they have to know everything, but a good solid understanding of how things work is the basic idea.
- 7. Most important, at least to me, is their Sense of Fair Play. We have all seen racers over the years that possess some or a few of these qualities, but when bump comes to shove, this particular attribute gets

left behind or thrown out the window, depending on the situation. This applies on the track, during negotiations with the rules committee, and during arguments about rules infractions and who gets the last beer after the race.

- 8. Comes prepared to help. Spare parts, rope to hang dothes, share knowledge, extra mower to run on race day in order to keep accumulating points for the season. Having made preparations to help others in advance, knowing someone will need something. #4 shows the willingness, #8 exhibits the forethought to add extra supplies, etc.
- 9. One of the traditions I enjoyed most was having a steak and a beer (or mower) after the race. I know most people want to run home. But there are always a few who will stick around or meet you on the way to the airport. This one is a bit hard to wrap your arms around, but I think this is part of the mix.
- 10. I always preferred plaques. Trophies can be hard to store, but there's always room for a plaque. A lot less dusting along with less space used.

(Established 2007)


Charles Powell was the driving force behind the USLMRA Local Chapter System. His support, guidance and forward-thinking are what has made the LC System so successful.





Memories of our Fallen Turf Warriors

Over the past years we have the unfortunate experiences of losing some great members of our organization. Racers like Dave Hertel, Charles Powell, Mike Leonard, Dubba G, Mike Cupps, and Jim Keech just to name a few. But this year has really been hard on us with the passing of Dr. Art Neavill and Janet Witt.

I guess I am really affected by these to great American racers because I spent a-lot of quality time both on and off the track with these to individuals. I would like to take a moment to pass along my memories of these.

My first encounter with the Lawn Blonde (Janet Witt) came in 2002 at the Sta-Bil Keeps Fuel Fresh Finals in Mansfield, Ohio. Watching her race in the IMOW race and in a major wreck at the finish line, WOW-what a will to compete this driver had. I hadn't had the opportunity to meet her yet, but I was totally impressed by her determination and courage on the track. It wasn't until later that I was informed that she was and had been battling cancer, and, even though she was



undergoing treatment, she was determined that this would not prevent her from doing what she loves to do and that was to race lawn mowers. In the years that followed as she moved to the AP Class I would be sharing the track with her, racing side by side (or trying to keep up with her), I was privileged to get to know her and her husband Jim better. I remember in 2004 at Avon Park, Florida in the AP feature race, as the green flag dropped

we ran to our mowers, and as I looked to my right, I saw Janet fall to the track. As we raced around she was way behind, but with her fierce competitive sprit she fought her way to the front and won. But the event that I will always remember will be in Albany, New York, the heat race for AP. We were again racing and all of a sudden there was Janet once again laying on the track, being attended by the medical team and taken away in the ambulance. As we lined up for the AP Feature later in the day, here comes the Lawn Blonde lining up for the start. WOW-now this was the real Iron Woman I thought, and off we went, and once again she was victorious.

Many people know what the words Loyalty, Duty, Respect, Selfless Service, Honor, Integrity, and Personal Courage mean. Many young American serving in today's Army know and live by these values every day, but I for one can say that this woman who never served a day in the military lived by these values. The one that will always stand out in my mind when I reflect on the Lawn Blonde is Personal Courage and this I quote from the Army:

"Personal Courage:

Face fear, danger or adversity (physical or moral). Personal courage has long been associated with our Army. With physical courage, it is a matter of enduring physical duress and at times risking personal safety. Facing moral fear or adversity may be a long, slow process of continuing forward on the right path, especially if taking those actions is not popular with others. You can build your personal courage by daily standing up for and acting upon the things that you know are honorable."

The man who I will always remember as the wise one with a challenging personality and deep concern for the sport of Lawn Mower Racing is Dr. Art Neavill. In my early years in the sport no matter where I traveled to race there was Doc., a friend to all racers, always there when help was needed, and always with encouraging comments. However quick to voice his displeasure when thing weren't right and willing to make a point wherever needed, no matter who he addressed his remakes towards. Everyone respected him for his outspokenness! Why? Because everyone knew he was right. He loved to be around

the young racers being a mentor, example and teaching the young. That was Doc. He was an Icon; he was the IMOW man, believed in the class though he also raced in SP, and later CP and GP classes as well but will always be remembered for racing in IMOW. My most memorable memories of Doc will be, first in Jessup, Maryland, racing against him in SP, both of us in the middle of the pack. After the race he came up to me and stated, "That's what racing is all about, racing side by side hard and clean." Though neither of us won, just by talking to him you would have thought he had won the Daytona 500. Second, several years later in Athens, Alabama, I was parked next to him in the pits. In the SP race I had a major accident and was treated by the medical staff. When I returned to my pit area, Doc had recovered my wrecked mower, packed all my gear, loaded my trailer and had me ready to go before I returned to my area. That was Doc! Over the years we became close friends, and I would call him from time to time just to talk or seek advice. Doc, like the Lawn Blonde, had medical issues as well, but that would not keep him away from the track. After open heart surgery he returned to the track, the average person wouldn't have ever thought of such a return. And finally last year at the Sta-Bil Finals Doc made his last ride around the track on his mower; I guess that was his version of the farewell lap. The next day I was honored to team up with this Hall of Famer and induct Bruce Kaufman into the Hall of Fame. This is a day I will always

When I think of Dr. Art Neavill, I think of the following:

Respect

I left Michigan feeling extremely honored to have known him, raced with him, and I will always be able to call him a close friend.

Art Neavill, a man who believed in consistency, being fair to all, a friend to all, being there to assist whenever needed, family first, education, and enjoying life.

Dr. Art Neavill, "You will live in our Hearts and Memories forever, May You Rest in Peace."

Greetings Fellow Racers;

During the past racing 2012 season, many things have crossed my mind in regards to racing and safety. After being a racer first, a National Chief Steward, and now the National Tech Director I learned that there are so many other things that need to be considered when the decision is made to race lawn mowers.

Prior to the start of the of the 2012 season we decided to take a big gamble and expand our field of racing classes to enable racers from all racing groups the opportunity to race within the USLMRA rules. This was probably the biggest gamble USLMRA had taken up to date. We understood that this expansion would require

the USLMRA staff to work harder and longer, but we felt that the end result would be well worth the gamble. And we were right. Adding the Governed Prepared classes for Adults and kids was a huge success, along with the addition of the FXS and FXT classes. We went from 7 classes to 11, the numbers may not seem a lot but taken in to consideration the number of races (Practice, Heats, and Features) you would think would mean longer days. Well to our surprise the fact was that with strong leadership running the races, the time running these races really didn't extend the day by that much. Bottom line was that despite some who may disagree this was an excellent move by USLMRA. With interest in the FXS and FXT classes starting to rapidly grow, we really expect that in the near future these two classes will be the fan favorites.

Over the past several years I have the opportunity to see firsthand and up close so many different types of mowers and some very interesting modifications made to these machines to transform them into race mowers. Remember the intent is to keep these machines appearance as close as possible to the original appearance as possible. And I must commend almost all of you; many of you take pride in what you have built. Why do I bring this up you may wonder? Well it's about the rules. We try our best to put together s set of rules with intent of outlining specific guidelines. I will mention just a couple;

Regulated classes (JP, IMOW, GP, GPK): We want to test the drivers skills in these classes, that's why we have specific guidelines in these classes, Gear Ratio, RPM, Tire Pressure for IMOW & JP for example. And I will say some of the best racing in the past has been in the IMOW with neck to neck racing and at times 3 wide in the turns. And the GP classes are just a step faster with just RPM regulated. Appearance:

We (USLMRA) want to keep the sport as it was originally intended to be, racing on machines that resemble Riding Lawnmowers as much as possible. These machines should resemble the Original Appearance as much as possible from the engine to the chassis, with the only exception being the Factory Experimental Classes (FX, FXS, & FXT). Ensuring these Mowchines resemble Riding Lawnmowers is the # 1 goal. Safety:

We continue to have an excellent safety record, yes there are some incidents/accidents that happen but nothing can ensure an accident-free event, that's racing. When actually on the track racing it's up to all drivers to pay extra attention to detail on their driving habits and maintaining awareness of the racers around them, learning the driving habits of other racers as well, and being prepared for the unexpected. We have to ensure that our mowchines are safely built from the engine to the chassis. Coming to the track prepared to race is the key. Yes things will happen, but the more time in preparing your mower prior to race day increases the chance of having an uneventful race day. Rules like the double throttle return spring, Axle mounted brakes in Prepared Classes and FX, Tether Kill Switches, requiring Billet Aluminum flywheels in prepared classes and FX, double lock nut on steering components, just to name a few, are for the safety of the drivers on the track and spectators alike. The Rules are not like some think (to make life miserable or chase away racers) but to try to make the sport as fun and safe as possible.

I have often said that "The USLMRA Staff" has a goal to keep this sport as safe and fun as possible. Remember No one wants to leave the track knowing one of their fellow racers has been injured and what could have been done to prevent it. It's the worst feeling you can have, I know I've had that feeling before.
